## **Head Office Series of etched zinc plates, 1st November, 1898 onwards: all 7".**

### **"Unlettered" Series of matrix numbers (F W Gaisberg *et al*)**

1. The system now involved a consecutive series of matrix numbers (subject to errors mentioned below) so that it was not necessary to start a new series every day. During March/April 1899 William Sinkler Darby made the first St Petersburg recordings apparently on the instructions of Joseph Berliner and the Hanover office unknown to London. For the first time, therefore, there were two Gramophone Company recording engineers working at the same time in different locations but Darby's records bear no matrix number so there was no risk of confusion at the Hanover factory which at the time was the only Gramophone Company factory in Europe.
2. Most early recordings made in London and processed for issue before the end of 1898 bear an "E" prefix (English), an "F" (French) prefix or a Gy (German) but some bear the wrong prefix (Edith Clegg's German language recording of Schubert's Heidenröslein is E) and some bear no prefix at all. It seems clear that the letter codes were not designed to indicate the language used but rather the country in which sales were anticipated and Edith Clegg was an English singer. A very small number of Greek, Japanese and Russian recordings were made; they carried "Gr", "J" and "R" prefixes respectively but none of these letter prefixes are shown in catalogues. These letter prefixes seem not to have been used after 28 December 1898. Kelly's French Catalogue enters French recordings made in London up to May 1899 as having an F prefix and repeats that in his Unlettered list but label scans do not support him and I have removed them all.
3. The separate language number codes had not yet been introduced. If the recording was still in the catalogue when they came into existence the F was replaced by a "3" and the Gy by a "4" (as indicated at the right of the entry in the list below. Such recordings then took their place in the relevant catalogue for that language. This consideration also applies to records in the Original series.
4. On 29 June 1899 London instructed Hanover to use the new language (number) codes adding 3 to French, 4 to German and 7 to Hungarian recordings already made. Hanover was also told to apply the new codes to the Austrian and Italian recordings which they would shortly receive and the renumbered records then took their place in the relevant catalogue under the generic title "Foreign" instead of "English" or "American". American Berliners were the mainstay of the English Gramophone Company catalogue until Fred Gaisberg had made enough English records for them no longer to be listed.
5. In his English catalogue Kelly enters all the Leipzig/Budapest recordings with both "English" and German 4 and Austro-Hungarian 7 numbers but precedes each sequence of entries "The following records were allocated numbers as shown in this catalogue [i.e. in the "English" series] but were transferred immediately to the German and Austro-Hungarian Catalogues and were not issued under their original numbers." This seems unlikely: it is probable that the Leipzig recordings had arrived at and been processed by the Hanover factory prior to receipt of the 29 June letter and PGA reports the existence of copies of a number of the Leipzig orchestral recordings bearing "English" numbers. In fact the Archive holding, although listing them in the 40000, show them with "English" numbers so they were all pressed in that form.
6. It seems to follow that recordings up to around the end of June could have been and probably were first issued with "English" numbers (with or without a Gy code for Leipzig) but that recordings received at Hanover after the end of June should have been given only the new numerical language code numbers beginning with the Budapest recordings, matrix 2303 etc. although 2303 had been used in Leipzig as well. No July or later recordings are reported as having "English" numbers.
7. For these reasons the Leipzig recordings have been entered with their "English" numbers (i.e. without 4) in the 2<sup>nd</sup> column and the German numbers added at the end of each line – as Kelly shows them in his English Catalogue – and the Budapest and later Vienna recordings with their Austro-Hungarian numbers.
8. In comparing the English parts of this list with Kelly's File A English Gram Cat. to be found in his CAT-O-FILES-HEAD OFFICE it was noted that the latter had a significant number of entries not included in this list and an attempt has been made by Peter Adamson [PGA] using the scans of all Berliner records held at the EMI Music Archive made by Robin Allen, an exercise funded by the Stratton Trust (Stephen Clarke), to expand this listing and to identify and rectify various inconsistencies between the two. In view of the rarity of pressings any reader who has one which shows different or additional details is invited to report his findings to the kellydatabase for inclusion in a future update.
9. There are a number of recordings evidenced by catalogue entries for which the matrix number is unknown. Some cannot be deciphered from pressings or scans: on occasion it was entered so close to the middle of the record as to have been drilled through or otherwise obliterated when the spindle hole was inserted and the surrounding area damaged. Kelly tried to identify and enter them in gaps where he anticipated they would fall.

Kelly and Perkins report (27TRC at 179) that an examined pressing of E4012 does not bear a serial number. It seems highly probable that it should have been allocated to 1 or 2 in this series. 4012X is 63 (see below).

The simple explanation is that the matrix number was accidentally used twice. I do not understand why the date (2/8/99) indicates that the session began before 2 July and we know from Sinkler Darby's diary that he and FWG were in Paris on 7 August packing before leaving for Spain. FWG's diary has no relevant entries for July

Note: This recording was made in two parts with "A" and "B" as catalogue numbers. Choruses 1 and 3 were omitted. Only the first version of "A" has a matrix number (4289). In each case the different versions can be distinguished by the presence of a secret manufacturing code involving a different number of Xs at 12 o'clock and a similar number of dots to the left of the word "Daily". The Hanover factory was told to start pressing from XXX which London regarded as the best version of each. None is dated but correspondence with Hanover confirms that they were sent to Hanover on 23 November for 5000 to be pressed and the first 1200 were sent to London on 2 December. A recording date 22 November seem likely and the one known matrix number (4289) would be consistent with that.

On 9 December 1899 FWG left London to return to the U.S.A. for Christmas. He returned to London on 1 February 1900 leaving for Hanover on 11 February but returning on 24 February, took records of Connie Ediss and Burt Shepard before leaving on 2 March to meet Darby in Berlin and proceed to St Petersburg where they used Darby's G series.

Note: there is a gap in recording between 7 Dec 1899 and 1 May 1900 when the first published Johnson wax recordings were made by Connie Ediss in what would become the "a" series. That was used exclusively until 18 May when Vess L Ossman made one wax record (629 not 638 as Kelly entered in his English Catalogue). Fred then made zinc recordings (listed here) and wax recordings (listed under "a"). His zinc recordings were as follows:
